

Player Expectations & Code of Conduct:

- Players are expected to attend weekly practices and encouraged to attend skills labs or goalie clinics
- Players are expected to attend all games
- Players/ Families will communicate game absences far in advance to allow for team coordination and potential player borrowing
- Players/ Families will use TeamSnap RSVP function for all games and practices
- Players will come to practices with all needed equipment including proper footwear, shin guards, reversible pinnie, and soccer ball
- Players will train and play with commitment and to the best of their ability
- Players will refrain from cell-phone use during practices- players may ask their trainer for permission to coordinate with family members about rides and in case of emergency.
- Players will check themselves out with their coach at the end of every practice to ensure player safety
- Players will listen and respond to The FosterSoccer coaches and parent coaches
- Players will respect their teammates, coaches, referees, and opponents at all times
- Players, coaches, parents and supporters are expected to actively demonstrate good sportsmanship, teamwork and supportive behavior at games and practices. The use of foule, derogatory, or discriminating language is strictly forbidden.



- No Bullying- PTSC believes that bullying is serious and has no place within the club. The PTSC Board has the authority to suspend or ban players that bully others. In PTSC's view, bullying occurs when a player, or group of players, intentionally and repeatedly try to get power over or hurt another player. Bullying occurs in four main ways: physical; verbal; relational; and cyberbullying. All forms of bullying are unacceptable, harmful and preventable. It is the role of coaches, managers, parents, supporters and players to take responsibility for stopping it.
- Players will play by the rules as directed by the referee
- Players will line up to shake hands with the opponent in a respectful manner after each game
- Players will leave the training field and game-day fields as clean or cleaner than when they arrived- and be responsible for discarding any trash or water bottles
